



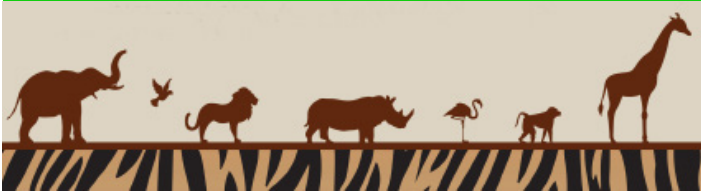

The Upper Merion School District in King of Prussia has a “Cafeteria Manager” position open. They are accepting applications at: [UMASD.org/Departments/HumanResources](http://UMASD.org/Departments/HumanResources). This position is for approximately 6 hours a day and will manage one of the 6 school kitchens. The hours are from 7:15 am to 2 pm. The first year salary is \$15.50/hour and increases to \$17.23 in the second year. The employee receives 3 personal days, 6 sick days, 2 paid holidays, and medical & dental benefits (with an employee contribution). The work schedule follows the student yearly schedule.

## MEANWHILE, IN HARRISBURG . . . Lunch Shaming Bill Drafted



**Pennsylvania Senate Minority Leader Jay Costa (D-Allegheny)** is seeking co-sponsors for a bill that would prohibit schools from discriminating against or stigmatizing children who have outstanding credit or don't have enough money to pay for meals. The bill is expected to be introduced this coming week and would require school districts to work with families to ensure every child has an opportunity to eat lunch and not be singled out for their financial situation. **U.S. Senator Bob Casey, Jr.** recently announced he was sponsoring the national “Anti-Lunch Shaming Act.”
