II. Advocacy & Public Image

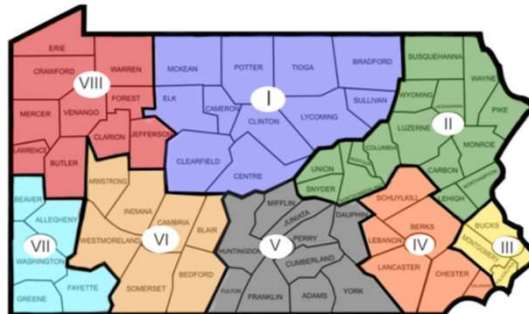
Policymakers, school officials, parents and school nutrition professionals will rely on SNAPA as the leading advocate for school nutrition programs in Pennsylvania.

2021-2022 Chapter Challenge

The School Nutrition Association of Pennsylvania's Chapter Challenges are designed to encourage chapters to assist in strengthening our organization as a whole. By completing the chapter challenges, the chapters help us meet the needs of our members through professional development and advocacy.

Challenge 1 - Professional Development

Offer at least 3 of the 4 training topics listed below during the 2021-2022 School Year:

1. NSLP/SBP Requirements
2. Farm to School
3. Food Safety and Sanitation
4. Advocacy for Federal Regulations

Challenge 2 - Advocacy & Public Image

1. Submit at least one article to be included in an issue of the SNAPA Happenings magazine.
2. Submit a photo and brief summary of at least two chapter meetings for use on SNAPA social media accounts.

Challenge 3 - Membership & Community

Pre-plan chapter meeting dates at the beginning of the school year. It is suggested chapters hold at least three meetings per year. Provide your Regional Representative with the dates and locations of each chapter meeting no later than September 30, 2021. Host one virtual meeting to earn a \$50 bonus award.

Challenge 4 - Governance & Operations

Submit the list of your chapter's officers (include name, position, phone number & email address) to your Regional Representative by September 30, 2021. Additionally, submit your 21-22 yearly financial information to your Regional Representative by June 15, 2022.
